This exhibition presents the artwork of students who participated in the 2023-2024 session of Art Ready, Smack Mellon's arts mentorship program for NYC public high school students interested in pursuing a career in visual arts. This year, students worked with professional artists who specialize in architecture, graphic design, painting, sculpture, ceramics, video and printmaking. The exhibition showcases an impressive range of media such as figurative paintings and drawings, handmade zines and art prints, videos, ceramic sculptures, and product designs, among others.

Art Ready engages young people in a way no other arts education program does—by pairing students directly with successful working artists. Mentors provide professional and creative guidance as the students make decisions about their futures in the arts. They tutor the students in their creative process, introduce them to new ways of working, and encourage critical reflection. Museum admission, mentor time, snacks, and subsidized transportation are all provided to students free of charge.
